


### **Dick Maughan Scholarship**

### Marine Environmental & Hazard Response Training

### Marine Oil Spill Response and Recovery (MOSRR)

This 3-day (22.5 hour) training and information session has been developed for Canadian Coast Guard and its partner agencies, coastal communities, Indigenous groups and industry, which have access to, and may be expected to deploy various types of pollution response equipment. Partner agencies and other groups can request this training under special circumstances.

### This course will enable you to:

#### Understand the Marine Oil Spill Preparedness and Response Regime

The mandate of Canadian Coast Guard (CCG) Marine Environmental & Hazard Response (MEHR) is to ensure an appropriate response to ship-source, mystery and oil handling facility spills to the marine environment. We also discuss how CCG works with other governments, partners and the private sector in both preparedness and response to spills.

#### Respond Safely

Emphasis will be on recognizing the potential site-specific hazards of petroleum products on the water and how to identify and use appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

### Assess an Oil Spill on the Water and Provide Information to Response and Regulatory Agencies

You will learn how to identify oil, its behavior within the marine environment, and how to estimate the quantity of a spill. You will also learn how to identify the source of the spill and accurately describe what actions are being taken to control, contain and recover the product.

### Boom Deployment and Oil Recovery

You will learn about different types of boom and how and why they are used in oil spill response. Additionally, you will learn about different types of skimmers and recovery equipment used to clean up oil spills. There are two practical sessions with boom deployment and skimmer operation.

We have received feedback from Small Craft Harbours (SCH) regarding their concerns about Vessels of Concern (VoC's). Over the past few years, there has been a steady increase of wrecked and abandoned vessels within harbours on the BC coast, despite all the work done by SCH and Transport Canada (TC) with the Abandoned, Wrecked Vessel Removal Program to clean up these vessels. SCH and the Canadian Coast Guard does not have continued funding available to deal with VoC's and harbours are the first line of defense in helping address this growing environmental issue. All harbours should have a moorage agreement in place with every user in the harbour, even if fees are not charged to access the facility. This will help ensure harbours are able to effectively deal with and enforce issues of non-compliance and can take action towards vessels at risk of becoming derelict.

Several useful documents can be found under the "Member's Only" section of the HAABC website, including an editable version of the model moorage agreement. Secondly, the flow chart and booklet on VoC's provide helpful information and resources for harbours who are currently dealing with derelict vessels.
