

Dear Harbour Authorities,

Pleas remember that we are now accepting funding applications under the Small Craft Harbours (SCH) Abandoned and Wrecked Vessels Removal Program (AWVRP) for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.

The AWVRP aims to reduce the number of abandoned and wrecked vessels in federally owned small craft harbours. These vessels can pose significant risks, including environmental harm, threats to the health and safety of harbour users, and impediments to the efficient operation of harbours. By removing these vessels, we enhance environmental protection, improve safety, and support the economic interests of coastal communities.

As a whole, the program has a national funding envelope of \$250,000 per year to support projects from Harbour Authorities and other eligible recipients across Canada.

Applications can occur year-round, and you are encouraged to submit them throughout the year, but priority will be given to those submitted by April 1, 2025. The application form, guide, Frequently Asked Questions, and other supporting documents, can be found:


